et me start this article by firstly saying that I did not set up the Epsom BKA Shop. It was started by beekeepers many types of tenders you take. When I started, we took cash and cheque only. There is nothing wrong with either of those today, but it is

experience in retail management to grow and maintain an apiary store for the benefit of members and the public. Helen and the Shop Team are working hard to help you with all the items you may need during the Winter months. Despite the recent mild weather, the Queens will be at their lowest laying rate or may indeed have stopped laying altogether around the winter solstice. This means midwinter is the perfect time to treat bees by sublimating or dribbling *Apibioxal* (the approved version of Oxalic acid).

Our shop is selling 35g packs of Apibioxal (enough for 10 treatments) for £13.50. So, if you want to treat then please arrange to purchase on either Saturday 14 or 28 January.

We also have good stocks of *Formicpro* the formic acid based Varroa treatment. It is less temperature sensitive – recommended use is whilst temperatures are about 10'c for first 3-5 days of treatment. So, if the weather remains mild this gives a good alternative to treat during January and February before colonies really start building up into spring

During January the shop will be open as follows:

- Tuesday 10 January from 7pm (before meeting no appointment needed)
- Saturday 14 January by appointment from 11:30am
- Saturday 28 January by appointment from 11:30am

All orders (we accept card /phone app or BACS transfer) should be emailed to <a href="mailto:shop@epsombeekeepers.co.uk">shop@epsombeekeepers.co.uk</a> before 8am on morning of the relevant Saturday and you will be given the next available 10-minute pick up slot. Please do everything you can to stick to the time given. This enables us to manage the flow of customers in and out of the shop keeping everyone as distanced as we can.

If you do not have an agreed pick-up slot - please do not come to the Apiary. When coming to collect purchases, please:

- Wear a face mask / covering
- Use the hand sanitiser provided on entry to our premises
- Maintain a 2m distance from our volunteers and other customers.

### **COVID GUIDELINES**

Government guidelines at the time of writing remain quite relaxed but there is increasing concern about a surge of COVID/ flu, so please do not come to the apiary if you have any symptoms of being unwell, such as;

- High temperature / fever
- New, persistent cough
- Loss of sense of smell/taste

# Making good use of your beeswax

If you couldn't come to our club Christmas candle dipping event why not take up the forthcoming opportunity from **Wisborough Green Beekeepers Association**. In early February the association is hosting a series of daily Demonstration Events entitled "Making good use of your beeswax".

Held on **Saturday 11, Sunday 12** and **Monday 13 February** the self-contained, daily events will showcase products that can be made with small quantities of beeswax using minimal equipment that is in most kitchens. The host - **Jim Ryan** from Thurles, Co Tipperary - "an amusing demonstrator, with an 'Irish way' "- will show the audience how to make such things



as furniture polish, furniture cream, lip balm, skin cream, moisture bars, soap, etc. If time permits, he will also look at using honey in recipes – honey lip balm, honey soap, etc. There may also be some alternative recipes that do not contain nut oils.

Judging by the success similar events hosted by Jim in previous years, the WGBKA are expecting the daily demonstrations to be very popular.

Places are limited and an early booking (Monday is recommended first choice) is essential. The venue is Hampers Green Centre, Petworth. West Sussex. GU28 9NL. The demonstrations start at 9.30am and finish
